Vegetative Debris - Tree limbs, logs, and branches.. Construction & Demolition Debris (C&D) - Building materials, drywall,

- lumber, carpet, furniture, roofing, plumbing.
- Storm-related Household Hazardous Waste Paint, oil, batteries, chemicals, cleaning supplies.
- Storm-Damaged Electronics TVs, computers, DVD players, phones.
- Storm-Damaged Appliances Refrigerators, washers, dryers, stoves.

Important Reminders:

- Only Hurricane Helene-related storm debris will be collected.
- Do not bag storm debris. Leave it loose for collection.
- Keep piles **at least five feet away** from hydrants, utility poles, meter boxes, sewer clean-outs, mailboxes, garbage carts, or structures.
- Avoid placing debris under trees, power lines, or areas that may obstruct collection vehicles.
- Storm debris should be placed in the right-of-way within ten feet of the roadside.
- Do not place debris where it could wash into waterways or storm drains.
- Regular household garbage and recyclables should go in usual carts for routine collection.
- Non-storm vegetative yard waste collection may be delayed during storm sweep.

How to Participate:

Storm debris should be placed in the right-of-way within ten feet of the roadside, and sorted into the following categories:



Storm Debris Removal Guidelines

*** Placing debris near or on trees, poles, hydrants or structures makes removal difficult. ***

- Household Garbage Garbage and recycling in carts for regularly scheduled collection
- Large Appliances Refrigerator, washer, dryer, air conditioner, stove, water heater, dishwasher (secure doors)
- Household Hazardous Waste Oil, battery, pesticide, paint, cleaning supplies, compressed gas
- Electronics Television, computer, stereo, phone, DVD player
- Construction Debris Building materials, _____ drywall, lumber, carpet, furniture, plumbing
- Vegetative Debris Tree limbs, logs, branches
